Children in small groups (Of no more than 15) are able to share certain equipment. 7) Reusable PPE should be thoroughly cleaned after use and not shared between coaches. These should be stored in suitable places. Facemasks are not required throughout activities however coaches will be required to wear enhanced PPE if dealing with a first aid incident. 8) Single use PPE should be disposed of so that it cannot be reused.

<p>Spread of coronavirus within school during sports.</p>	<p>4 X 4 = 16</p>	<p>Limit the spread by:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Advising all coaches and children to go through the Government Covid-19 guidance for educational settings poster attached. 2) Ensuring children are kept at a 2 meter distance at all times. Coaches to plan and prepare all sessions before the start of the session with this in mind. 3) Supervise children washing their hands before and after sessions. 4) All equipment cleaned before and after sessions with appropriate cleaning products. 5) Catch it, bin it, kill it approach. 6) Advise the children and remind regularly that they should not touch their eyes, mouth or nose throughout the sessions. 7) Limit contact with door handles by leaving walk way doors open if possible. 8) Ensure ventilation into a hall or room if session is taking place inside. 9) Children not to share equipment that involves using their hands ie; Balls, Sticks, Bats, Rackets, Gym mats.
